


## Red Corridor Curriculum Update

## SUPERTATO TO THE RESCUE



## **Curriculum Intention Focus:** To develop our roles in routines.

This term, Red corridor will be learning how to be super in everything that they do as we increase our independence. Our theme is **Superheroes**, and we will be using the books 'Supertato' and 'This is me!' as stimuli for many of our learning activities.

Across all of our lessons, we will be taking more of an active role in collecting the equipment that we need and making decisions about what to use.

Our cooking lessons will also allow us to experience new tastes and textures as we work together to make super smoothies and soup using some of the fruit and vegetable characters that we meet in Supertato.

In art, we will be using out preferred communication method to make choices about the colours and vegetables that we would like to use when we create vegetable prints.

This topic provides the opportunity for lots of sensory exploration and use of our fine motor skills as we make and play with superhero slime and have fun during messy vegetable play sessions.

We will also continue to develop our independence during our PSHED lessons, working on our personalised targets that could include teeth or hair brushing, getting dressed or turn taking as needed.
